REGULAR MEETING, November 1, 2017

*The board held a work session at 6 pm for a building report and budget update. They also discussed the steps needed to pursue impact fees.

*Roll call was taken. Board approved the agenda. Minutes from the October meeting were approved.

*Congratulations/Information–No school November 22-24 Thanksgiving Break. Three graduates, Reid Ernst, Blake Ferris and Shiloh Megel received their American FFA Degree at the National FFA Convention. It is the highest degree earned by members, only 14 others from Wiggins have received this honor.

. Congratulations to the High School Volleyball Team for making it to Regionals!

*Public Participation – Sara Kopetzky thanked Jim Bostron and Brian Baker for their service on the board.

*Board Reports – Kris Musgrave stated that he will be serving on the Preschool District Council.

*Mr. Kerr, Superintendent, reported on the upcoming legislative issues including the CHIP Program, E-Rate and SALT-D and CASB support or non support of each issue. With the purchase of the property to the west of the event center, the maintenance department has been preparing it for event parking. Phone calls and automated messaging are being sent to parents of students with negative or low lunch account balances. A group of sophomores and juniors took the PSAT. The transportation department has been busy with repairs. The technology department is working on updating the intercom system and cameras for improved safety district-wide. The district's E-Rate application has been approved. The board election will be November 7.

*Lisa Trautwein presented the 1st Quarter Preschool Report: The Wiggins Fire and Police Department provided safety talks to the preschoolers. The first Gold Assessment checkpoints were due October 27. Parent teacher conferences will be November 6-10. Almost \$1300 was raised through the fundraiser held with the elementary. Creative Curriculum was purchased. Enrollment is at 59 and student attendance was 95.47% for the quarter.

*Mrs. Boyer presented the 1st Quarter Elementary Report: The elementary is running two sections at each grade level with the exception of 1st, where there are three teachers for intense literacy instruction. Teachers have been attending various professional development trainings. Beginning of Year benchmark data was collected through GOLD, DIBELS and NWEA assessments. Parent teacher conferences were attended by parents at an average of 98% TPO has completed their first fundraiser of the school year. The fundraiser money will be used for the interactive classroom TVs. The student attendance was 97.43% and there were 20 behavior events.

*Mr. Book presented the 1st Quarter Secondary Report: Outdoor Ed took 41 students to YMCA. Mrs. Wujek received an all expenses paid field trip for 30 students to the Space Foundation Discovery Center in Colorado Springs. Mr. Shaw took the Pep Band members to a Colorado Rockies game where they played the National Anthem with other schools. Dr. Saulmon and Mrs. Wujek are members of the Teacher Advisory Group for the new STEM teacher prep program through Colorado School of Mines and UNC. Teachers have been attending blended learning professional development trainings. There have been a total of 6 suspensions in grades 6-12 this quarter.

*Mr. Book reported on the secondary CMAS and PARCC results. The middle school is accredited and the high school is on an improvement plan scoring 51.8 % needing 52% to be accredited. Both schools scored at or above the state level in the achievement area. Growth results at the high school level do show need for improvement.
